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Itinerary of your cruise

Day 1 - Friday FORT-DE-FRANCE	The largest of the French West Indian towns blends cosmopolitan style and local colour, with its urban lifestyle, colourful markets, metal architecture and charming old houses. Stopover for boarding and disembarking. Ship docked in port.
Day 2 - Saturday ST LUCIA	This proud volcanic island is a pillar of ecology, with its two majestic rocky peaks swathed in green and its lovingly preserved surroundings. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no snorkelling), beach.
Day 3 - Sunday TOBAGO CAYS	A dazzling array of blues on the most beautiful coral reef in the Grenadines. Tropical fish sport the most fascinating colours in these crystal clear waters. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach.
Day 4 - Monday MAYREAU	The smallest of the Grenadine Islands has just one little village, surrounded by idyllic beaches with the finest sand, crystal clear waters and multicoloured tropical fish. Ship at anchor, water sports available (no water skiing), beach. Private beach for the Caribbean Beach Club.
Day 5 - Tuesday GRENADE	This small island territory is home to fragrant nutmeg, cinnamon and vanilla. A succession of colonial influences has left a fascinating heritage of architectural curiosities. Ship at anchor, no water sports, no direct access to a beach.
Day 6 - Wednesday BARBADOS	The Atlantic Ocean and the Caribbean Sea make for a fascinating contrast on this small coral island: Its wild, green northern face contrasts with the azure blue waters of the south and their specific fauna and flora. Ship docked, no water sports and no direct access to a beach.
Day 7 - Thursday LES TROIS-ÎLETS	The town covers the entire southern coast of the bay of Fort de France and is the birthplace of Josephine, first wife of Napoleon Bonaparte. Its three very distinct and divided sectors encompass the picturesque village of Trois îlets, the shops and pedestrian streets of the new Creole village of Pointe du Bout, and Anse Miton and the beach of Anse à l'Ane. Boat at anchor, beach and water sports available.
Day 8 - Friday MARIE-GALANTE	Windmills bear witness to the sugar industry that played such a major role in the history of this charming island with its magnificent beaches. It still produces the world's best rum. At anchor. Beach and water sports.
Day 9 - Saturday POINTE-À-PITRE	Spices, flowers, fish and fruit, the local markets abound with colour and exotic produce from this generous island paradise. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call. Ship docked in port.



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Excursions of your cruise

Day 2 - Saturday ST LUCIA / ISLAND TOUR (1/2 day - afternoon)*	You'll discover the island's colonial past when we stop at St Mark's House in Castries. You'll have some amazing views of the island's lush vegetation as we drive along the Caribbean coast. We'll visit a former plantation, Morne Coubaril Estate, a gift from Louis XIV to the Deveaux family. To the present day the family's descendants produce sugar cane, copra, coconuts and manioc. And you'll discover La Soufrière with its fascinating geological activity, before getting back onto the boat in Soufrière Bay.
Day 3 - Sunday TOBAGO CAYS / CATAMARAN MORPION ISLAND (1/2 day)*	Morpion - also known as Mopio - will make your paradise island dream come true! A tiny white sand island with a straw hut and palm tree leaf roof, the main function of this speck of paradise is to indicate the way to sailors. This highly photogenic spot has featured in magazines worldwide: today, it's all yours!
Day 4 - Monday MAYREAU / CATAMARAN, THE HEART OF THE GRENADINES (1/2 day)*	his postcard morning accompanied by an atmosphere and a purely Caribbean cocktail on board will take you to the translucent anchorages around the island of Mayreau. The climate, always suitable for swimming, will encourage you to refresh yourself in the turquoise waters of the Grenadines unless you prefer to tread on the sparkling sand.
Day 5 - Tuesday GRENADA / ISLAND TOUR (day)*	The Spice Island is as rich in aromas as in landscapes. You will visit the famous Diamond Chocolate factory in Victoria, which produces Jouvay chocolate, ranked among the best chocolates in the world. In addition, Different stops will allow you to discover the luxuriant nature of this authentic island. Finally, you will enjoy a local lunch at the Belmont Estate in an 18th century cocoa plantation.
Day 5 - Tuesday GRENADA / FORT AND BEACHE BY LOCAL BUS (1/2 day)*	You'll discover St Georges - the charming capital, known as the Little San Francisco of the West Indies - in a vintage truck. You'll stop at the Frederick Fort that look out over the town, and after a detour in the nearby hills, where you'll have a great view of the interior of the island, you'll have the chance to swim from one of Grenada's most beautiful beaches.
Day 5 - Tuesday GRENADA / LA CAPIJE (1/2 day)*	You'll start this magnificent forest trekking at "Grand Etang". It'll take you through a plantation where you'll see cocoa, nutmeg and bananas, and then on to the bamboo waterfalls where you can enjoy a refreshing swim. Crossing the river : so wet sneakers
Day 5 - Tuesday GRENADA / WATERFALLS AND CHOCOLATE (1/2 day)*	This aromatic island tour will allow you to get to know everything about the "Jouvay" organic chocolate production at the Diamond Chocolate Factory nestled in the village of Victoria on the west coast of Grenada. You'll find it in an 18th-century converted rum distillery, which was built by French monks. Nowadays, the factory's responsible for making Jouvay - one of the world's top 10 chocolates, according to National Geographic. This chocolate's completely organic and you'll learn how it's made - from the harvest of the cocoa beans, to watching them dry on trays under the Caribbean sun. A visit to the garden of cocoa trees to see, cocoa, cloves, chili, nutmeg, flowers, fruits, followed by a delicious chocolate tasting, will conclude this pleasant visit to one of the most amazing sites in the Caribbean. On your way back, you make a detour to enjoy a swim (conditions permitting) in the natural lovely pool at the Concord Falls. Here the nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the flanks of the hills in the tropical forest that is forever near. Please note: guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under a cover-up, bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, and a towel. The order of the stops may vary. Guests must be at least 5 years old to participate. Long way by bus to discover the magnificence of the island.
Day 6 - Wednesday BARBADOS / REMOTE BARBADOS IN A 4X4 (1/2 day)*	From sugar cane fields to tropical forest via the village of Bathsheba, you'll drive over dirt tracks through the most inaccessible parts of the island and see the finest views of the Atlantic coast. (bumpy road)
Day 6 - Wednesday BARBADOS / SUBMARINE (1/2 day)*	A unique opportunity to admire the splendour of the tropical sea. Venture into this realm of silence, 50 metres down, on a high-tech submarine. Discover the coral reefs (sea fans, sponges) and fish (angel, butterfly, surgeon and boxfish, to name but a few). Visibility depending on weather.
Day 6 - Wednesday BARBADOS / LITTLE ENGLAND (1/2 day)*	Don't miss this opportunity to discover the treasures of what we call "Little England" in the West Indies. First Farley Hill, a popular meeting place for Barbadians, then Bathsheba, a small fishing village beaten by the waves of the Atlantic and known to surfers from all over the world. Treat yourself to a refreshing drink at the new Hillcrest Community Center and finish with Codrington College. Long way by bus.
Day 6 - Wednesday BARBADOS / HISTORIC PLANTATION & TRAIN (1/2 day)*	Embark on a magical train ride through the rolling hills of St. Nicholas Abbey. Discover the historic Jacobean mansion, its steam mill, and rum distillery. Enjoy breathtaking views after a scenic journey along Cherry Tree Avenue. On your way back, admire the wild beauty of the stunning East Coast.
Day 7 - Thursday TROIS ILETS / MEMOIRS FROM MARTINIQUE (1/2 day, morning)*	Leaving Les Trois-Îlets, you will visit the surprising Savane des Esclaves, a place that tells the story of the slaves on the island's plantations. You will then visit the Musée de la Pagerie, the birthplace and home of the famous Joséphine de Beauarnais, who later became the wife of Napoléon Bonaparte. A journey back in time to the 19th century in the islands.
Day 7 - Thursday TROIS ILETS / CATAMARAN*	Set sail for a dreamy half-day catamaran cruise from Les Trois-Îlets! Glide along the stunning Martinican coastline, taking in breathtaking views of the iconic Diamond Rock, then enjoy a refreshing swim and snorkeling session in the crystal-clear waters near the famous Bat Cave. Sunshine, relaxation, and a friendly tropical vibe await you throughout this unforgettable escape at sea. Refreshing drinks served on board: punch, juice, water... everything is provided for your comfort and enjoyment.

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Day 8 - Friday MARIE GALANTE - ISLAND TOUR (1/2 day)*	A wonderful introduction to Marie Galante, carefully curated by our expert local guides. Visit to the Château Murat (1807) and its beautiful grounds, a rum tasting at the renowned distillery, and then a return to St Louis. You couldn't wish for a better initiation into the wonders of the Lesser Antilles.
Day 9 - Saturday GUADALUPE / BASSE TERRE - THE MAMELLE PARK (1/2 day - morning)*	A superb excursion to discover the fauna and flora in the north of the island: you'll visit the Cascade aux Ecrevisses and walk in the Parc des Mamelles animal park where, if you have a head for heights, you can do the canopy tour.
Day 9 - Saturday PTP / ONE DAY AT CLUB MED LA CARAVELLE (1day)*	Located on Grande-Terre, enjoy a fantastic day at Village La Caravelle, established for more than 30 years on one of the most beautiful beaches of fine golden sand in Guadeloupe. Return directly to the airport. Day pass from 10am to 3pm.

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Formalities

HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.
