

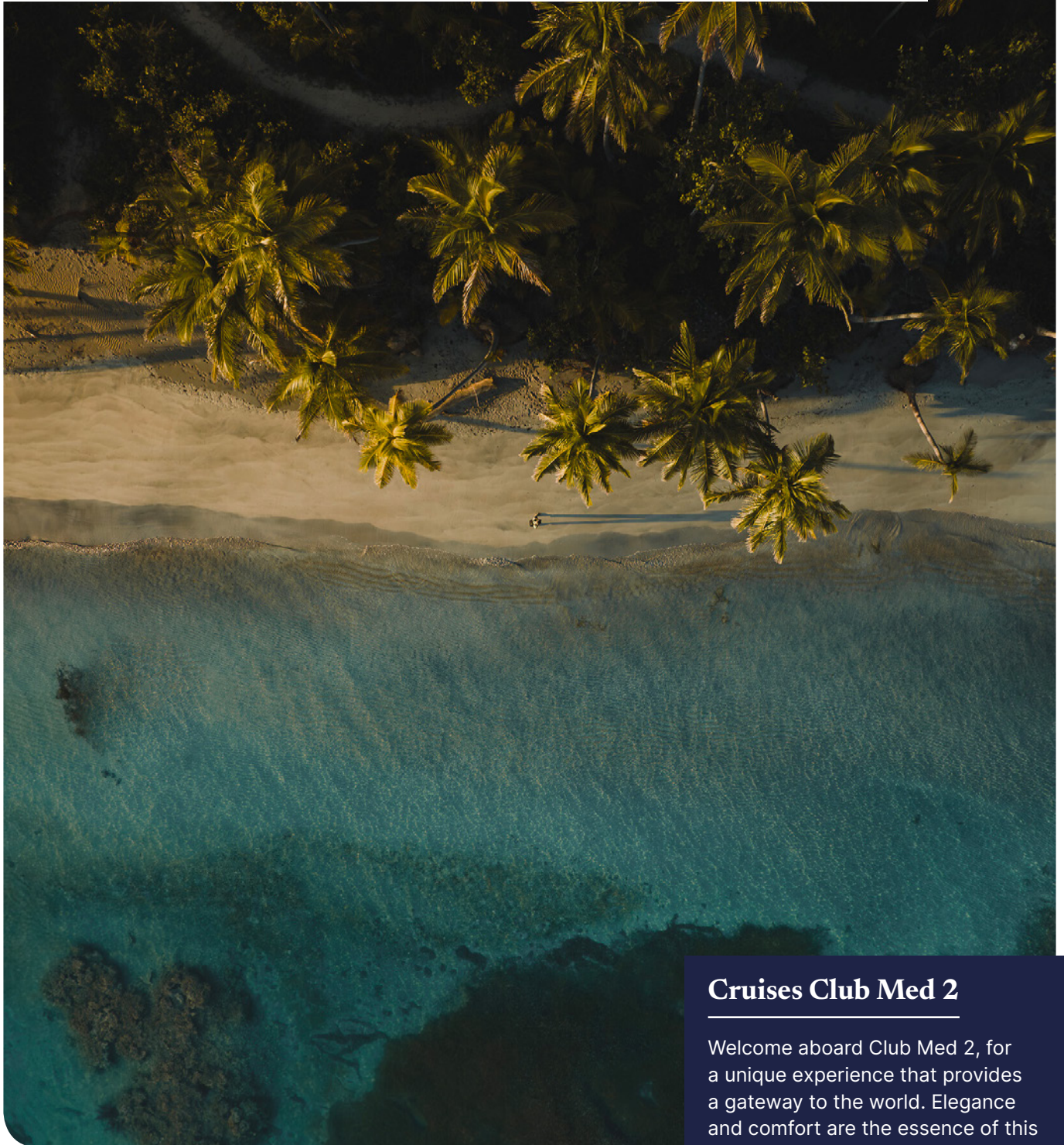

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## Itinerary of your cruise

<b>Day 1 - Saturday</b> <b>POINTE-À-PITRE</b>	Spices, flowers, fish and fruit, the local markets abound with colour and exotic produce from this generous island paradise. Passengers boarding and disembarking at this port of call. Ship docked in port.
<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> <b>MARIE-GALANTE</b>	Windmills bear witness to the sugar industry that played such a major role in the history of this charming island with its magnificent beaches. It still produces the world's best rum. At anchor. Beach and water sports.
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> <b>NEVIS</b>	This tiny volcanic island, sister island to St Kitts, where the traditional sport of cricket remains a national game, is a fascinating world of hot water springs, archeological sites and forests inhabited by green monkeys. AShip at anchor, water sports available, beach.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> <b>SAINT-BARTHELEMY</b>	A mountainous island that has become a symbol of luxury. A fabulous blend of serenity and upscale tourism, with 17 beautiful beaches. Ship at anchor, water sports available, beach.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> <b>SAINT MARTIN</b>	Magnificent coves, hills, long strips of sand separated by a few sea lagoons and no less than 74 nationalities rub shoulders on this island where a simple welcome sign marks the border between France and Holland. Boat docked, beach, dive locker closed.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> <b>ANGUILLA</b>	A long strip of amazingly white sand delicately posed on turquoise water. This miniature island attracts the VIPs of this world, who love its intimacy and discretion. Ship at anchor, water sports available, beach.
<b>Day 7 - Friday</b> <b>JOST VAN DYKE</b>	This tiny, mountainous island belonging to the UK Virgin Islands, is reputed to be named after a Dutch pirate. It offers superb views of the dazzling blue sea and solitary islands. At anchor, beach and water sports.
<b>Day 8 - Saturday</b> <b>SAILING ON THE OPEN SEA</b>	A restorative day at sea. Choose from the range of inviting possibilities on our remarkable sailing ship. Lounge on chaise longues, cool off in one of our two swimming pools, work out with a sea view in our Espace Fitness, find instant calm at the spa and enjoy the attentive company of our G.O® team and crew members.
<b>Day 9 - Sunday</b> <b>PUERTO PLATA</b>	It was on this coast of the island, known as the Amber Coast, that Christopher Columbus first landed on 11 January 1493. The old colonial town centre is home to beautiful pastel-coloured Victorian wooden houses and is a pleasant location for a stroll. Boat at dock, nautical hall closed.
<b>Day 10 - Monday</b> <b>BAIE DE SAMANA</b>	Waves of immigration and trade have come to Samana Bay over hundreds of years. Napoleon's troops seized the bay area in the 19th Century, later selling it to the USA. Well-preserved with an authentic historical feel, the bay boasts beaches, mountains and luxuriant plant life. Ship at anchor, no water sports.
<b>Day 11 - Tuesday</b> <b>ÎLE CATALINA</b>	The small island of Catalina, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is known for its coral reefs and pristine beaches rich in white sand. Its turquoise waters make it easy to see coral, multicoloured fish and all the richness of this region. Private beach for the Caribbean Beach Club. Boats at anchor, no water sports.
<b>Day 12 - Wednesday</b> <b>LA ROMANA</b>	A little port, built in 1851 to ease maritime traffic. The town was only officially founded in 1897. The city itself only began to grow 20 years later, when Italian immigrants built a large windmill for grinding sugar canes. Ship docked, no water sports. Boarding and disembarkation port of call.





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## Excursions of your cruise

<b>Day 2 - Sunday</b> MARIE GALANTE - ISLAND TOUR (1/2 day)*	A wonderful introduction to Marie Galante, carefully curated by our expert local guides. Visit to the Château Murat (1807) and its beautiful grounds, a rum tasting at the renowned distillery, and then a return to St Louis. You couldn't wish for a better initiation into the wonders of the Lesser Antilles.
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> NEVIS / ISLAND HIGHLIGHTS AND BOTANICAL GARDEN*	Visit this charming island - known as the Queen of the Caribbees - its historic sites and its 8 acre Botanical Gardens. This highly popular tour includes a visit to Hamilton House, birthplace of Alexander Hamilton, one of the USA's founding fathers. Your tour will also take in the Botanical Gardens, where you can admire one of the biggest and most diverse botanical collections in any tropical region.
<b>Day 3 - Monday</b> NEVIS / HIKING*	Enjoy a 2-hour hike to discover Nevis' lush greenery and natural heritage. You'll have the opportunity to walk through the Rainforest while appreciating the island's flora and fauna. The tour ends on Pinney beach, where a swim will round off this beautiful morning's hiking.
<b>Day 4 - Tuesday</b> SAINT BARTH / CATAMARAN (1/2 day)*	Sail north along the stunning coast of St. Barths aboard a luxurious catamaran. Upon reaching the pristine Colombier Bay Nature Reserve, take the opportunity to swim in its crystal-clear waters for an unforgettable experience.
<b>Day 5 - Wednesday</b> SAINT MARTIN / PANORAMA OF ST MARTIN (1/2 day)*	Take the chairlift for an easy and effortless ride up to the highest point of the Dutch part of Saint Martin and enjoy 360 degree panoramic views out over the Caribbean Sea.
<b>Day 6 - Thursday</b> ANGUILLA / DÉJEUNER LANGOUSTE À SANDY ISLAND*	Take a short 10-minute boat ride to the stunning Sandy Island, a true tropical paradise. Swim in crystal-clear turquoise waters, explore vibrant reefs, or relax on soft white sand. Enjoy premium food and drinks with effortless luxury. After a blissful day, ferry back to the mainland and rejoin your ship.
<b>Day 9 - Sunday</b> PUERTO PLATA / CHOCOLAT EL CHOCAL*	Come meet this community of courageous women who have set up their own artisanal chocolate workshop. They will explain to you the different stages of chocolate manufacturing and what products they offer. The reputation of their "chocolate bar" is well established. You will discover the sumptuous landscapes of the Cordillera Central, the highest mountain range in the Caribbean with its Pico Duarte reaching 3175m. A beautiful moment of sharing that will leave you with a sweet taste!
<b>Day 9 - Sunday</b> PUERTO PLATA / CITY TOUR*	Stop at Fort San Felipe, built in 1577 to protect the port from pirates, visit a cigar factory, an amber and larimar museum where you can carry information about these ancient stones. You will have the opportunity to see the street of umbrellas and the famous pink street in honor of Doña Blanca.
<b>Day 10 - Monday</b> SAMANA BAY / LOS HAITISES NATURAL PARK (half day)*	Explore Los Haitises National Park. from the sea Navigate through this natural labyrinth of vertically-trained sugar cane in the bay which is the habitat of numerous colonies of seabirds, before heading off to explore the mangrove forest. You will visit one of the park's caverns which bears traces of religious beliefs, left by the first Native American inhabitants of the Dominican Republic.
<b>Day 10 - Monday</b> SAMANA BAY / WHALES OBSERVATION SEAFARI*	Head off in a boat exclusively chartered for Club Med to meet humpback whales. During the mating season, hundreds of humpback whales come to the warm waters of the bay to breed. You will witness the amazing spectacle of the males leaping out of the water and the young whale calves swimming beside their mothers. On the way back, you'll have time to swim and enjoy the fine sandy beach at Cavo Levantado if wanted.
<b>Day 12 - Wednesday</b> LA ROMANA / ONE DAY TO PUNTA CANA RESORT (1day)*	Before your flight, enjoy a wonderful day at the Punta Cana Resort, relax on its magnificent coconut palm beach and enjoy the Dominican atmosphere. Day pass from 10.30am to 4pm. Return directly to the airport of Punta Cana.
<b>Day 12 - Wednesday</b> LA ROMANA / CAVE OF WONDERS (1/2 day, morning)*	Explore the amazing 240 square metres of the Cave of Wonders. In the midst of stalactites, columns and other rock formations, you will discover ancient drawings left behind by the first indigenous people of the Caribbean. On your way back, you will stop off at La Romana where you can do a spot of shopping at the village market.

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## Formalities

### HEALTH FORMALITIES

Recommended vaccinations: diphtheria, polio, tetanus, hepatitis A and B and typhoid. Some parasitic or viral diseases can be carried by mosquitoes during certain stopovers. The use of skin and clothing repellents is therefore recommended. Pregnant women who do not need constant medical supervision may come aboard, upon presentation of a medical certificate showing their due date and certifying that their pregnancy is compatible with the cruise. The final day of the cruise must be before the end of the 26th week of pregnancy. A doctor and a nurse are present on board.

## Meeting place for boarding

Port de Pointe-à-Pitre / Guadeloupe. Terminal de Croisières - Port de Bergevin. Transfert aéroport Pôle Caraïbes / Port Pointe-à-Pitre : 10 km (environ 25 minutes)
